ZOOM BEST PRACTICES

- 1. Sound quality is important for all participants, but critical for those who may be hard of hearing. If you are the primary presenter, ensure you are in a noise free environment and be sure to mute participants who are not speaking.
- 2. Reviewing sessions again is one of the top benefits students reported in their classes going remote, so consider recording your session.
- 3. If using chat, be sure to share it in a variety of ways. Two methods to consider are:
 - a. Reading the chat out loud during the session
 - b. Saving the chat to share once the session is done

USC ZOOM LIVE CLOSED CAPTIONING

Message from USC Information Technology Services Oct 29, 2020

Zoom has provided USC with an opportunity to participate in the early release of live closed captioning for Zoom meetings. This service will transcribe spoken voice to text live during the meeting and will help support students and other meeting participants who need special accommodations.

What to Know

- On Friday, October 30, we will implement this new Zoom feature to enable a live transcription **service** to show a caption transcription in the side panel of the meeting window.
 - NOTE: This feature is currently not available to the general public; USC is the recipient of the early release of live transcription.
- Live captioning is made possible through artificial intelligence; we expect the transcription accuracy to be consistent with other products available.
- The service is approved by the Office of the Chief Information Security Officer and meets USC information security standards.
